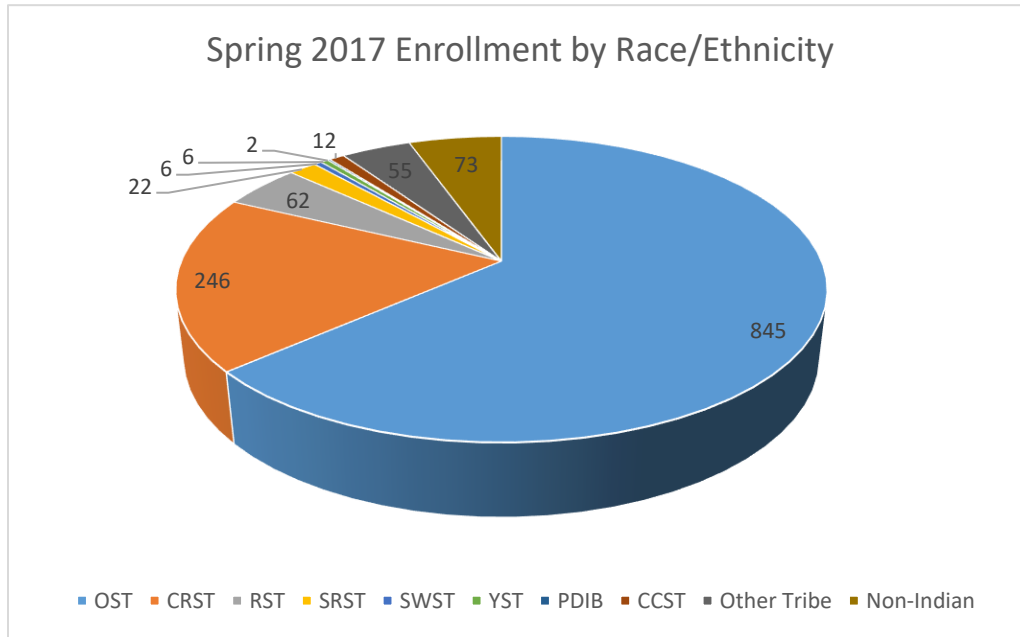

Fast Facts

Oglala Lakota College monitors student progress in two ways, retention and persistence. Retention is measured by identifying students who are enrolled from Fall to Fall. For example, as student is retained if they enroll in the Fall of 2015 and the Fall of 2016.

The College also monitors persistence of students. Persistence is measured from Fall semester to Spring semester. For example, students persist who take classes in the Fall of 2016 and the Spring of 2017. The table below shows the numbers and percentage of students who have been retained from year to year and who have persisted between Fall and Spring semester.

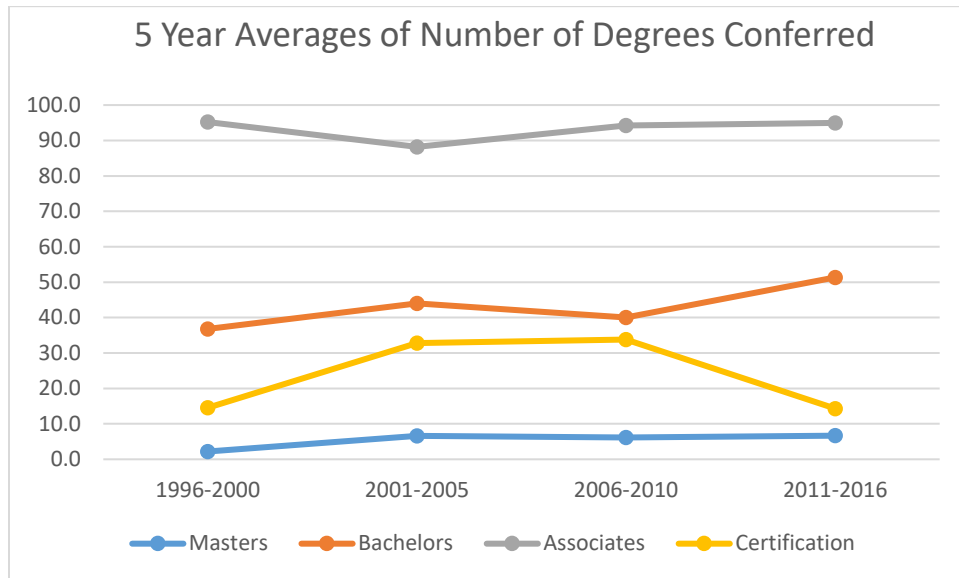
